1.0 Executive Summary

In May 2026, Levites Care Ministries successfully conducted two Phase 1 missions of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program in Bukoba, Tanzania. The missions were hosted at Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) Bukoba led by *Pastor Lucas* from 3rd May to 7th May 2026 and at Shalom Pentecostal Church led by *Bishop Crawford* from 10th May to 14th May 2026. These missions were part of the ministry's continued commitment to equipping and strengthening servants of God within local church communities across Africa.

The seminars focused on introducing foundational teachings of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program, aimed at empowering church workers and ministry leaders to serve more effectively in their churches. Core teachings included topics such as the Holy Spirit, the Altar, Worship, the Anointing, and Children's Church ministry. The sessions also incorporated worship, prayer, and interactive engagement with participants.

At Tanzania Assemblies of God Bukoba, a total of 39 servants of God participated in the program, with 24 participants remaining consistent by attending more than three sessions. At Shalom Pentecostal Church, 44 participants attended, with 26 demonstrating consistency throughout the seminar. Combined, the two missions reached 83 participants, with 50 participants showing consistent commitment to the program.

Both missions were successfully completed by God's grace and were marked by positive participant engagement, spiritual growth, and encouraging feedback from church leaders and attendees. The successful implementation of these Phase 1 missions has strengthened ministry partnerships in Bukoba and laid a strong foundation for future phases of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program in the region.





2. Introduction

The Levites Capacity Transformation Program is a ministry initiative by Levites Care Ministries dedicated to equipping and strengthening servants of God within local church communities. The program was established to address the growing need for spiritual empowerment, ministry development, and practical biblical training among church workers, leaders, worship teams, and other individuals serving within the Body of Christ.

In May 2026, Levites Care Ministries conducted two Phase 1 missions in Bukoba, Tanzania, as part of its ongoing vision to strengthen churches across Africa through training and ministry empowerment. The first mission was hosted at Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) Bukoba under the leadership of Pastor Lucas from 3rd May to 7th May 2026. The second mission was conducted at Shalom Pentecostal Church under the leadership of Bishop Crawford from 10th May to 14th May 2026.

These missions focused on introducing foundational teachings of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program, including the Holy Spirit, the Altar, Worship, the Anointing, and Children's Church ministry. Through worship sessions, prayer, biblical teaching, and participant interaction, the program aimed to spiritually equip participants and strengthen their understanding of faithful service in God's Kingdom.

The missions were successfully carried out by God's grace and received positive engagement from participants and church leadership alike. This report summarizes the implementation, participant involvement, achievements, challenges, and overall impact of the two Phase 1 missions conducted in Bukoba, Tanzania.





3.0 Mission Overview

3.1 Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) – Bukoba

The first Phase 1 mission was conducted at Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) Church in Bukoba under the leadership of Pastor Lucas from 3rd May to 7th May 2026. The mission aimed to introduce the foundational teachings of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program to servants of God within the church community.

The program sessions were held over five days and included worship, prayer, biblical teaching, and participant interaction. The teachings focused on foundational ministry topics including the Holy Spirit, the Altar, Worship, the Anointing, and Children's Church ministry. Participants were encouraged to actively engage through note-taking, discussions, and prayer sessions.

A total of 39 servants of God attended the program, with 24 participants remaining consistent by attending more than three day sessions. The participants demonstrated spiritual hunger, active participation, and appreciation for the teachings delivered throughout the seminar.

The mission was successfully completed and strengthened the partnership between Levites Care Ministries and Tanzania Assemblies of God Church in Bukoba.

3.2 Shalom Pentecostal Church – Bukoba

The second Phase 1 mission was held at Shalom Pentecostal Church under the leadership of Bishop Crawford from 10th May to 14th May 2026. Following the completion of the first mission, the Levites Care Ministries team continued its ministry work in Bukoba by introducing the program to another church community within the city.

The five-day seminar followed the same structured approach of worship, intercession, biblical teaching, and ministry engagement. Participants were equipped through teachings designed to strengthen their spiritual lives and improve their effectiveness in ministry service within the local church.

A total of 44 servants of God participated in the program, with 26 participants remaining consistent throughout the seminar by attending more than three day sessions. The overall response from participants and church leadership was positive, with many expressing appreciation for the spiritual insight and encouragement received during the program.

The successful implementation of the mission at Shalom Pentecostal Church further expanded the reach of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program within Bukoba and created a strong foundation for future ministry collaboration.





4.0 Program Implementation and Methodology

The Levites Capacity Transformation Program was implemented through a structured five-day seminar format designed to create an environment of spiritual growth, learning, and active participation among church servants. Both missions at Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) Bukoba and Shalom Pentecostal Church followed the same ministry approach to ensure consistency in program delivery.

Each day of the seminar began with participant registration and preparation for the sessions. Participants were encouraged to attend consistently, engage actively, and take notes during the teachings. Worship sessions were conducted before the teachings to create an atmosphere of prayer and spiritual openness. These moments of worship and intercession helped prepare participants for ministry and learning throughout the program.

The training sessions focused on foundational ministry topics including:

- The Holy Spirit
- The Altar
- Worship
- The Anointing
- Children's Church Ministry

Each topic was taught through biblical teaching, practical ministry examples, discussions, and interactive engagement with participants. Facilitators guided the sessions while allowing opportunities for participants to ask questions and share experiences related to ministry service within their churches.

Prayer sessions were also conducted throughout the seminars, allowing participants to receive spiritual encouragement, personal ministry, and guidance. The overall methodology emphasized spiritual transformation, servant leadership, and practical ministry empowerment within the local church context.

The structured implementation of the program contributed to strong participant engagement and helped maintain consistency among attendees throughout both missions.





5.0 Achievements

The two Phase 1 missions conducted in Bukoba, Tanzania were successfully completed by God's grace and resulted in several important achievements for both the participating churches and Levites Care Ministries.

Key Achievements:

- Successfully conducted two Phase 1 seminars at:
 - Tanzania Assemblies of God (TAG) Bukoba
 - Shalom Pentecostal Church
- Reached a total of 83 servants of God across both churches.
- Recorded a total of 50 consistent participants who attended more than three sessions of the program:
 - 24 consistent participants at TAG Bukoba
 - 26 consistent participants at Shalom Pentecostal Church
- Strengthened ministry partnerships with Pastor Lucas of Tanzania Assemblies of God and Bishop Crawford of Shalom Pentecostal Church.
- Successfully introduced foundational teachings of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program to new church communities in Bukoba.
- Created an atmosphere of spiritual growth, prayer, worship, and ministry empowerment among participants.
- Encouraged servant leadership and deeper understanding of ministry responsibilities within the local church.
- Received positive feedback and appreciation from participants and church leadership regarding the relevance and impact of the program.
- Expanded the reach and visibility of Levites Care Ministries within the Bukoba church community.

These achievements reflect the growing impact of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program in equipping servants of God and strengthening churches across the region.





6.0 Challenges and Solutions

Although the two missions in Bukoba were successfully completed, a few challenges were encountered during the implementation of the program. Through teamwork, flexibility, and God's grace, these challenges were effectively managed without affecting the overall success of the missions.

1. Participant Consistency

Challenge:

Some participants were unable to attend all seminar sessions due to personal responsibilities, work schedules, and church commitments. This affected overall consistency levels during the program.

Solution:

The ministry team encouraged participants to prioritize attendance and remain committed throughout the seminars. Session reminders and continuous engagement helped improve participation, resulting in 50 participants consistently attending more than three sessions across both churches.

2. Time Management During Sessions

Challenge:

Interactive discussions and prayer sessions occasionally extended beyond the planned schedule due to high participant engagement and ministry needs.

Solution:

Facilitators adjusted the program flow while ensuring that all core teachings were successfully covered within the seminar period. Additional time was allocated where necessary to allow participants to fully benefit from the sessions.

3. Logistical Coordination

Challenge:

Managing movement, scheduling, and preparation between two consecutive missions required careful coordination and flexibility from the ministry team.

Solution:

Through cooperation with church leadership and proper planning by the Levites Care Ministries team, all activities were conducted successfully and according to schedule.

Despite these challenges, both missions were completed effectively and continued to demonstrate the faithfulness of God throughout the implementation of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program in Bukoba, Tanzania.





7.0 Financial Overview

The two Phase 1 missions conducted in Bukoba, Tanzania were successfully implemented through God's provision and the generous support of ministry partners and donors who continue to support the vision of Levites Care Ministries. The financial resources provided enabled the ministry team to effectively conduct the seminars and facilitate all mission activities across both churches.
