1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In May 2025, Levites Care Ministries carried out a historic mission to Gaborone, Botswana, marking the first introduction of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program into Southern Africa. The mission was led by a team of six adults and one child who traveled from Uganda to Botswana by air, arriving safely through God's provision after overcoming significant travel-related challenges. The purpose of this mission was to pioneer Phase 1 of the program and to lay spiritual and relational foundations for future ministry across the nation.

Following a week of fasting and spiritual preparation, the mission team was warmly received by Pastor Owusu of Christ's Oasis Ministries, where Phase 1 of the program was officially launched. The training was held from 14th to 18th May and was attended by over 20 church leaders and ministers, primarily from Christ's Oasis and a few from surrounding churches. The participants were equipped with foundational teachings on spiritual service, including topics such as the Holy Spirit, Altar ministry, Worship, Anointing, and Children's Church.

The program was met with enthusiasm, deep engagement, and positive feedback from attendees. Several testified to personal spiritual renewal and a greater sense of clarity in their calling. The success of this Phase 1 mission created momentum across the city by God's power, opening doors for further engagements with other church leaders between 19th and 23rd May. These strategic meetings resulted in interest and future commitments to host the program in multiple churches during a return mission scheduled for November 2025.

The mission concluded with a time of rest and reflection before the team returned to Uganda on 28th May. This report documents the journey, spiritual impact, key encounters, and strategic outcomes of this foundational mission—one that marked a significant step in expanding the reach of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program across the African continent. To God be the glory.





2.0 INTRODUCTION

The Levites Capacity Transformation Program is a mission-centered initiative by Levites Care Ministries, designed to equip and empower individuals who serve in various capacities within the Body of Christ. Often referred to as modern-day “Levites,” these individuals are the spiritual and functional backbone of local churches—leading worship, teaching, praying, counseling, and supporting the work of the ministry. Despite their central role, many of these servants lack access to structured spiritual training and personal development resources. This program exists to fill that gap.

In May 2025, by the leading of the Holy Spirit, Levites Care Ministries launched its first mission into Southern Africa, beginning with the nation of Botswana. The goal was not only to introduce the Levites Capacity Transformation Program but also to spiritually plant and establish its foundation in the region. The Phase 1 mission, hosted at Christ’s Oasis Ministries in Gaborone, served as a pioneering effort to both train local church ministers and form new strategic partnerships with leaders across the city.

This report captures the entire journey—from the team’s travel and spiritual preparation to the successful delivery of the program and the growing interest from other ministries. It highlights the fruit of the mission, the challenges encountered, and the hand of God that guided every step. More than a travel log or event summary, this report is a testimony of divine timing, obedience, and the beginning of what we believe will be a long-term transformational impact on churches in Botswana and beyond.





3.0 TRAVEL AND ARRIVAL

On 6th May 2025, a mission team from Levites Care Ministries—comprising six adults and one child—embarked on a pioneering journey from Uganda to Gaborone, Botswana, to launch the first-ever **Phase 1** of the **Levites Capacity Transformation Program** in Southern Africa. The team departed from Entebbe International Airport, traveling via Kenya Airways with scheduled stops in Nairobi, Kenya, and Johannesburg, South Africa. The overall journey spanned approximately 13 hours.

While the team was covered by God's grace throughout the journey, a significant challenge arose at O.R. Tambo International Airport in Johannesburg. Due to international travel requirements involving minors, the team encountered difficulty because they were traveling with a child and the mother—but lacked a letter of consent from the father. This became a pressing concern as the team was initially not cleared to proceed to their next and final flight to Gaborone.

As tension built and time dwindled, the team prayed earnestly for God's intervention. Efforts were made to contact the father back in Uganda, who began working on the required documentation, but was unable to finalize it in time. In what the team can only describe as a divine miracle, just three minutes before the boarding gate closed, airport authorities permitted them to proceed—with the understanding that the letter of consent would be sent afterward. This moment became a powerful testament to God's favor and timely help in moments of great pressure.

Upon safely arriving at Sir Seretse Khama International Airport in Gaborone, the team was warmly welcomed by a devoted woman of God who serves as Levites Care Ministries' national coordinator for Botswana. She received the team at the airport and personally drove them to a rental house that had been arranged by God's provision. Transportation needs within the city were also met through a pre-arranged vehicle rental, again made possible through God's faithful provision.

This smooth transition into the city and the presence of a local coordinator ensured that the team could focus their hearts and minds on the mission ahead. The travel experience, though marked by one major obstacle, was ultimately a powerful reminder that God truly goes ahead of those He sends.





4.0 SPIRITUAL PREPARATION

Recognizing the spiritual weight and pioneering nature of this mission, the Levites Care Ministries team dedicated themselves to a period of prayer and fasting upon arrival in Botswana. From 8th May to 14th May 2025, the entire team engaged in a seven-day fast with the express purpose of aligning themselves with the Holy Spirit, consecrating the land, and opening the spiritual gates of the nation for ministry.

This period of spiritual preparation was not only a personal discipline but a prophetic act of intercession. As the first Phase 1 mission in Southern Africa, it was vital that the team enter into ministry from a place of spiritual clarity, humility, and readiness. Each day was marked by corporate prayer, Scripture meditation, and declarations over Botswana and the mission ahead. Prayers were also lifted for the participants, the host church, and the future doors God would open in the nation.

The fasting period concluded on 14th May—the very day the program was scheduled to begin. By then, the team had not only grown in unity and spiritual sensitivity, but had also laid a firm spiritual foundation over the city of Gaborone. This preparation helped create an atmosphere for the presence of God to move freely throughout the duration of the program.

This intentional spiritual posture proved critical. Throughout the mission, the team encountered divine favor, open hearts, and fruitful engagement—clear evidence that the spiritual groundwork had been effective. The fast also prepared the team to minister from a place of discernment and boldness, having already warred in the spirit for the success of the mission.





5.0 MINISTRY LAUNCH: CHRIST'S OASIS CHURCH

On Sunday, 11th May 2025, the Levites Care Ministries team was warmly welcomed to Christ's Oasis Ministries in Gaborone, where they attended a worship service and officially met with the church's senior pastor, Pastor Owusu. This divine connection marked the beginning of a fruitful partnership. After a time of fellowship and shared vision, Pastor Owusu wholeheartedly opened his church to host the first Phase 1 seminar of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program in Botswana.

The program was officially launched on 14th May and ran for five days, concluding on 18th May. Each day of the seminar focused on one foundational topic of the program, aimed at equipping church leaders and ministers with biblical and practical understanding of their call to service. The five core topics covered were:

1. The Holy Spirit in Ministry
2. The Significance of the Altar
3. Worship in Ministry
4. Foundations of Children's Church Ministry
5. The Anointing for Service

The sessions were structured to include worship, prayer, teaching, Q&A discussions, and Spirit-led ministry. The daily atmosphere was marked by deep spiritual hunger, heartfelt engagement, and openness to the move of God. Worship sessions ushered in the presence of the Holy Spirit, setting the tone for the teachings, while prayer intercessions led by the Levites Care team kept the atmosphere spiritually charged.

The participant turnout exceeded expectations, with over 20 ministers and church workers in attendance. Most were from Christ's Oasis Church, but several had also heard about the program through Pastor Owusu and his dear wife Ma'muruti and joined out of a hunger to grow in ministry.

As the program progressed, participants grew more connected, not only to the material but to one another. The teachings were met with enthusiasm and reflection, and the practical examples shared by facilitators resonated deeply with those in attendance. Many attendees expressed gratitude for how the sessions confirmed their calling and provided tools they had long desired in their service to the church.

The final day of the seminar closed with powerful prayer and a shared sense of joy and purpose. Pastor Owusu, along with several other leaders, expressed deep appreciation for the training and affirmed their desire to host future phases of the program.

This launch not only established the program in Botswana but also set a precedent for future missions to be received with trust, favor, and readiness.





6.0 PARTICIPANT FEEDBACK AND OBSERVATIONS

The Phase 1 training held at Christ's Oasis Church in Gaborone drew over 20 church ministers and workers who engaged actively throughout the five-day seminar. As the sessions progressed, it became evident that the program was meeting a deep spiritual and practical need within the participants. Their feedback and behavior during and after the program provided strong affirmation of the program's relevance and effectiveness.

Positive Feedback Highlights:

- Many participants expressed that they had never received such authentic, biblical, and genuine Spirit-led teachings on topics relevant to God's servants.
- Several ministers shared that the session on Worship deeply challenged and revived their personal approach and understanding of worship, reminding them that the essence of worship is yielding our spirits to God not merely a performance.
- The teaching on Children's Church was especially eye-opening for many, as it revealed the strategic role of children's ministry in building future generations of the Church.
- Attendees appreciated the structure and clarity of the program, the opportunity to ask questions, and the open spiritual atmosphere that made it safe to share, reflect, and grow.

Participant Observations:

- From the second day onward, the level of participation increased as attendees began to arrive earlier, take detailed notes, and remain behind for one-on-one guidance.
- The participants demonstrated humility, hunger, and a deep desire for more—qualities that created a fertile ground for transformation.
- One pastor shared, "This program has rekindled my zeal for ministry. I feel more confident to lead and implement different ideas in my church."

The overall tone of feedback was one of gratitude and renewed purpose. Even participants from outside Christ's Oasis expressed a strong desire for the program to continue in their churches. Many asked when Phase 2 would be available, and some even offered to volunteer in future programs.

The feedback and spiritual engagement of these participants confirmed what had been spiritually discerned during the fasting period: Botswana is indeed ready, and the fields are ripe for a servant-leadership revival. The success of this first mission created momentum not only for future phases at Christ's Oasis but also opened doors for expansion into new churches.





7.0 STRATEGIC FOLLOW-UP AND EXPANSION

Following the successful implementation of Phase 1 of the Levites Capacity Transformation Program at Christ's Oasis Church, the impact of the program began to echo beyond the hosting congregation. From 19th to 23rd May 2025, the Levites Care Ministries team dedicated their time to engaging with various church leaders and ministries across Gaborone who had heard of the program's effectiveness and were eager to learn more.

Key Outcomes of the Follow-Up Week:

- Several pastors and ministry leaders reached out through the Levites Care Ministries' **National Coordinator of Botswana**, expressing their interest in hosting the program.
- Personal meetings were held with a number of them, during which the vision, structure, and impact of the program were clearly explained by the Levites Care Team.
- Some of the leaders had witnessed the program firsthand at Christ's Oasis or had received testimonies from participants, which built immediate trust and desire to host it in their own churches.

These engagements were not just administrative—they were marked by prayer, discernment, and strong spiritual alignment. It became clear that the Holy Spirit was stirring hearts across the city to receive the Levites Capacity Transformation Program as a tool to strengthen leadership and revive ministry structures.

Key Agreements and Commitments:

- A collective agreement was made to return to Gaborone in November 2025 to hold additional Phase 1 trainings in other churches that had shown interest.
- Some pastors offered to mobilize ministers from their networks to ensure greater impact during the next visit.
- There was a request to introduce the program to regional fellowships and pastor alliances in Botswana, further expanding its potential reach.

This week of follow-up confirmed that the mission had not only opened doors—it had sparked a wave of spiritual hunger and strategic alignment. What began as a single training at one church has now become the seed of a citywide movement, one that promises to multiply across churches and denominations.

The team returned from these meetings full of joy, deeply aware that the success and momentum were not by human effort alone, but a result of God's favor and divine orchestration.





8.0 REST AND RETURN TRAVEL

After two impactful weeks of ministry and strategic engagements across Gaborone, the Levites Care Ministries team took a brief period of rest from 24th to 27th May 2025. This time was intentionally set aside to recover physically, reflect spiritually, and prepare mentally for the journey back to Uganda.

The rest period provided an opportunity for the team to:

- Spend time in touring some of Gaborone's tourist sites as a way of refreshment.
- Debrief as a team—sharing personal insights, testimonies, and lessons learned.
- Regain strength after an intense season of teaching, fasting, travel, and spiritual warfare.

Though restful, this time was also spiritually enriching, as the team felt the peace of God affirming the mission's success and confirming that the doors in Botswana had been divinely opened.

On 28th May 2025, the team departed from Sir Seretse Khama International Airport in Gaborone and flew back to Uganda via the same airline, Kenya Airways. The return journey followed the same route as the departure, with transit stops in Johannesburg and Nairobi. Unlike the outbound trip, the return travel was smooth and uninterrupted—another sign of God's faithful covering.

The team arrived safely in Uganda, grateful for all that God had done. They returned not only with testimonies, but also with renewed fire and clarity for the upcoming return mission in November 2025.





9.0 ACHIEVEMENTS

The May 2025 mission to Gaborone, Botswana marked a historic milestone for Levites Care Ministries, as it officially introduced the Levites Capacity Transformation Program to the Southern Africa region. By God's grace, the mission accomplished far more than logistical goals—it established spiritual foundations, opened new ministry doors, and affirmed the global relevance of the program. The following are the key achievements of the mission:

Successful Launch of Phase 1 in Botswana: The team successfully conducted the full five-day Phase 1 program at Christ's Oasis Ministries, delivering impactful teachings to over 20 church ministers and workers. This achievement marked the program's first official deployment in a Southern African nation.

Spiritual Transformation among Participants: Many participants reported personal spiritual renewal, deeper understanding of their ministry roles, and fresh revelation in areas such as the Holy Spirit, Worship, Altar and the Anointing. Several testimonies reflected deliverance, breakthrough, and rekindled passion for serving in God's house.

Strong Local Partnership with Christ's Oasis Church: Through the leadership of Pastor Owusu, the church not only hosted the program but fully embraced its vision. The partnership laid a strong relational and spiritual foundation for future phases, including the anticipated Phase 2 in November 2025.

Expansion Opportunities Secured: As word of the program's impact spread, multiple church leaders across Gaborone expressed interest in hosting future sessions. Strategic meetings led to commitments for additional Phase 1 missions in November 2025, significantly expanding the program's footprint in the region.

Local Coordination Strengthened: The support of the Botswana-based coordinator—who received and assisted the team throughout the mission—proved essential in logistics, mobilization, and follow-up. Her involvement strengthened the ministry's ability to operate smoothly and confidently within the country.

Fasting and Spiritual Preparation Completed: The team's seven-day fast served as a spiritual breakthrough, consecrating the land and preparing the atmosphere for ministry. It not only aligned the team with God's will, but also laid a foundation for spiritual authority and favor throughout the mission.

This mission's success has reinforced Levites Care Ministries' calling to equip and strengthen the Church across nations. The testimonies, connections, and momentum gained in Botswana are evidence that the Lord is enlarging the borders of this work—one obedient step at a time.





10. CHALLENGES AND GOD'S DELIVERANCE

Even as the mission in Botswana was marked by divine favor, the journey presented notable challenges that tested the team's faith and logistical preparedness. Yet each obstacle became an opportunity to witness God's timely intervention and steadfast provision.

1. Child Travel Documentation

At O.R. Tambo International Airport (Johannesburg), the team was initially denied boarding for the final flight to Gaborone due to the absence of a father's letter of consent for the accompanying child. Immigration regulations posed a risk of delaying or even preventing entry into Botswana.

God's Deliverance:

Under mounting pressure, the team earnestly prayed for a miracle. Just three minutes before the flight's departure, officials reversed their decision—allowing the group to board on the assurance that the required consent letter would follow. This sudden breakthrough underscored God's grace in the face of seemingly insurmountable legal hurdles.

2. Cultural and Logistical Coordination

As the first deployment of the program in Botswana, coordinating with a new local partner and navigating unfamiliar cultural norms required swift relationship-building and clear communication.

God's Deliverance:

Through the faithful work of the Botswana coordinator **Ma'Dube**—a seasoned woman of God—the team was seamlessly hosted, transported, and welcomed into local church circles. Her established connections and prayer support smoothed every transition, demonstrating how God prepares the way through faithful servants.

3. Spiritual Warfare and Fatigue

Intensive fasting, back-to-back ministry days, and the emotional weight of pioneering a new region led to physical and spiritual exhaustion among team members.

God's Deliverance:

Daily debriefs, prayer cover from the Levites Care intercessors, and moments of shared worship renewed the team's strength. The sense of God's presence during deliverance sessions uplifted weary hearts, reminding everyone that "His strength is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).





11. FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

The Botswana mission in May 2025 was made possible through the faithful provision of God and the generous support of partners who believe in the vision of Levites Care Ministries. Every aspect of the journey—from international flights to accommodation, in-country transport, meals, and training materials—was covered through careful stewardship and divine provision.
